1. Call to Order / Introductions / Correspondence / COSC

 - e. Weekly updates; sent out every Sunday afternoon for the week but please continue to check the calendar as things are sometimes added after the update

 - During the week, classes will monitor kind acts by writing on a strip of paper the kind act that they witnessed. At the end of the week, the strip of papers will all be linked together to form a chain that will decorate our gym hallway.
 - Grade 6 student leaders will be reading books based on this theme with the grade 1, 2 and 3 students will be doing activities with different grade levels throughout the week

6. French Immersion in EIPS – Superintendent Mark Liguori

- Superintendent Liguori opened by explaining that EIPS is aware of and monitoring registration in French immersion within the district and shares that EIPS is committed to supporting the program into the future.
- The district is considering options to accommodate program growth and has promised to provide a statement as to a solution before the 2019/20 Kindergarten registration (January 2019).
- EIPS faces a few challenges pertaining to facilities: There are few potential sites for new schools and EIPS must compete with EICS and Francophone boards for access to sites. Currently, there are no feasible options for an elementary school specifically.
- Further, renovations required to upkeep our current facilities are a priority (specifically Sherwood Heights, as that building needs to be replaced). Sherwood Heights is the junior high French option for students in Sherwood Park; Ardrossan senior for high school.
- EIPS works diligently on capital plans consistently, publishing three- and ten-year plans, which address facility needs in the district. EIPS also encompasses many rural schools that have specific needs to be provided for by the school board.
- Overall, EIPS is committed to supporting language programs within the district and seeks a plausible solution to accommodate increasing registrations into the French immersion programs.

7. New Business

A. Halloween Dance follow-up

- Thank you to all volunteers who helped make the event successful! We made just over \$200, and the night was enjoyed by many students and their families.

B. Communication survey results

- 207 participants in the survey provide feedback that communication methods and streams (council reps and weekly updates) are effective. Many suggestions received regarding other community involvement events such as work with seniors, science fair, and more demonstrations of the arts. These suggestions will be researched and considered moving into the new year.

C. Christmas Hamper assembly (TBD) – Volunteer sign-up
