1. Call to Order / Introductions / Correspondence / COSC
 - Curtis Christopher called the meeting to order at 6:32 pm.
 - Correspondence: French Immersion information night at Ardrossan Junior/Senior at 6:30 pm.
2. Approve Minutes from ECSC Meeting – January 15, 2019
 - Katie Berghofer motions to approve the January 15, 2019. Seconded by Nadine Best. All in favour.
3. Approve Agenda --- additions / deletions
 - Nadine Best made a motion to approve the October 9, 2018 agenda with moving item 6 above item 4. Seconded by Lara Nonay. All in favour.
4. Trustee Report – Trina Boymook
 - Report attached.
5. Administration Report – Lisa Sauder
 - Annie Garneau: a new portable will replace the one in poor condition this upcoming school year.
 - March is Alberta Francophone Month: Campbelltown will celebrate Tantemarre with the local Francophone school at Festival Place and Carnaval on March 1st.
 - March also brings a variety of French events including Unitheatre, Galala (at Cité Francophone), and International Francophone day which will be celebrated with M. Berubé and grade 6's with an original song.
 - March 15 is speech competition for division 2 students.
 - Shelley Boswell: Randon Acts of Kindness Week activities are student lead by the grade 5/6 leadership group: events include positive notes on lockers, "take a smile" poster, leadership students reading about kindness to division 1 students, and a focus on Recramis.
 - Pink Shirt Day is February 27th; for anti-bullying awareness week.
 - School fees will be presented at the March parents council meeting.

6. French Immersion information evening debrief

- Curtis Christopher provides a summary of the meeting held February 11th concerning the addition of a dual track program opening in the 2020/21 school year at the new Heritage Hills school:
 - Division Principal Dave Antymniuk and school principals Lisa Sauder and Bill Schlat provided information on the new program and fielded questions from meeting attendees.
 - The new school in Heritage Hills will house the 490 students coming from Wye Elementary and approximately 113 students from Ecole Campbelltown based on the division boundary set at the EIPS January 24th board meeting. This will allow enrolment pressures at Campbelltown to be addressed and will use excess capacity at the new school.
 - Lisa Sauder spoke to single versus dual track programs; highlighting that both can be equally successful with a strong school administration in place, along with access to support services and resources.
 - Bill Schlat spoke to having experience in French Immersion schools and about upholding an inclusive environment in the new school.
 - Ultimately, boundaries and student grandfathering are EIPS board decisions. Exemptions may be considered on a case-by-case basis. EIPS will survey families and will make a decision regarding grandfathering and exemptions at the May EIPS board meeting.

7. New Business

1) Crayola marker recycle program
