This week, the Grade 5 students will be participating in the Blanket Exercise with Elder Wilson. The Blanket Exercise is an interactive timeline of events from pre-contact to present day. Students take the role of Indigenous peoples throughout the exercise so that they can develop a deeper understanding of the relationship between the Crown and Indigenous peoples in Canada, from the settlers' arrival to modern times. Our favorite part of this activity is listening to the students' profounds reflections during the sharing circle that Elder Wilson leads after the exercise.

As the school year winds down, we would like to extend our gratitude towards Elder Wilson for all the support that he has provided our school this year.
