## 3. New Business

- a. Committees: literacy, numeracy, physical literacy, French culture

  - Numeracy to work with a staff member, support numeracy events in the school, examples may include math contests, Pi day, science fair
  - Physical literacy to support the school with athletic activities, may include sports day, intramurals, sports clubs
  - French culture to encourage french language and culture, may include Epulchette, french movie nights

# b. Parent inquiry: supply lists

- Some supplies frustrating parents, Staples stock issues
- Supply lists are set by district based lists on original group of teachers who had recommendations
- Will advocate for supply lists to be made at the school level not district level at COSC and with Trustee

# c. Parent inquiry: staff lists

- Email addresses are <u>first.lastname@eips.ca</u>
- However, staff are not listed online, can access child's teacher address only through Powerschool, not helpful if you need to contact other teachers
- Will advocate for listing staff or making contact with all staff an option on school websites at COSC and with Trustee

# d. Parent inquiry: Brightspace and communication

- Brightspace is supported and encouraged over email in EIPS
- Parent/Guardian access is different from Student (Child) access and content differs between both as well
- Brightspace was a tool brought in for online learning during covid and is not ideal for communication, it is also expensive for the district

- Will advocate for movement away from Brightspace back to email for communication between teachers and parents/guardians
- Mr. Probert has asked all teachers to provide one newsletter or classroom update to parents/guardians per month at minimum. If this isn't happening in your child's classroom, follow up with the teacher and Mr. Probert.
- e. Children at meetings: is there an interest in organizing child supervision?
  - In the past, childminders were able to monitor kids in the gym while parents are in the meeting
  - Based on interest, will pursue for next meeting; details to follow
- f. Parent involvement: ideas?, clubs?, community events?
  - School council is looking for volunteers interested in joining the committees: Literacy, Numeracy, Physical Literacy, French Culture; staff are available to work together with committees on projects
  - Are there volunteers who would like to start or run a club at the school?
  - Community event ideas for school council: family dances, flower bed planting, collecting recyclables in classrooms, school ground clean-up, adopt-an-elder card making, science fair
  - Previously, school council has hosted a Hallowe'en Dance this could happen again this year on Friday October 28th, but volunteers are needed to organize it!
